Your Reception

Our Mountaineer Restaurant can hold up to 90 for a sit down or buffet dinner. For larger (up to 120) parties, we also use our Great Room and adjacent restaurant. Space available for a tent to seat up to 250 guests. We require a 60 person minimum to close our restaurant on the weekends. Smaller receptions can be scheduled for between 12 pm – 4 pm, if needed. Our website offers menu selections and price information.

Lodging for you and your guests.

We have 25 rooms and 3 cabins, and require a two night minimum stay during "in-season". Couples have chosen the North Woods Inn over the years because of the possibility of planning a multiple day event with a flexible schedule of activities unique to the Adirondacks.

Property Amenities

The North Woods Inn is situated on 7 acres of lakefront property, has 2 restaurants, lodging, a great room with fireplace overlooking the lake, a tavern and conference room, large fire pit for guests at night, heated swimming pool, small swimming area, boat slips, large dock, an outdoor gazebo directly overlooking the lake for ceremony.

Planning your Spring Wedding in the Adirondacks

Spring is a time of rebirth and renewal and a perfect choice for a wedding. Late winter skiing is a popular activity for your guests - as are gallery tours, shows, and shopping in nearby towns and villages. Your spring decorating ideas are endless. Many couples employ daffodils, pussy willows, and pastel themes. Don't worry about April showers, as there is nothing more romantic than a bride and groom under a large umbrella. In fact, guest umbrellas themselves can be part of the décor! Pink and green are popular color schemes for spring weddings, as well as celadon green with white, and a silver accent. The addition of a Maypole does double duty as both entertainment and a decoration in the spring. Consider inviting your guests to throw rose petals or release butterflies rather than throw rice. Consider having the bridal party arrive by canoe or kayak.



Planning your Summer Wedding in the Adirondacks

Kids are definitely not the only ones to have fun in the Adirondacks. A summer wedding here at our waterfront resort means access to rowboats, speedboats, canoes, sea kayaks, jet skis and windsurfing. Guests can hike, ride horses, play golf and tennis or breeze through hills on mountain bikes.



Waterskiing, picnics by the lakes, or backpacking on the many local trails are all available. Planning your Fall Wedding in the Adirondacks

Access to over 500 miles of snowmobile trails groomed daily is a real draw for some bridal couples. Ski enthusiasts will enjoy McCauley Mountain, known as "the most challenging little mountain in central New York." located within 10 minutes of the Inn. They also offer 20km of tracked and groomed cross country ski trails that range from Novice to Expert. Fake fur is popular with winter brides, as are accessories that sparkle. Choices for your winter décor are endless, including everything from white feathers to poinsettias, evergreens and candles! Ice blue is a favorite winter color scheme, especially combined with silver and gold metallic touches. Theme-based weddings could include Christmas, Valentine's Day, or "Jack Frost" themes! How about a "Dr. Zhivago-style Russian wedding? Because people have fewer social engagements in the winter, more of your guests might be free to attend. Consider arriving by dogsled or snowmobile!
